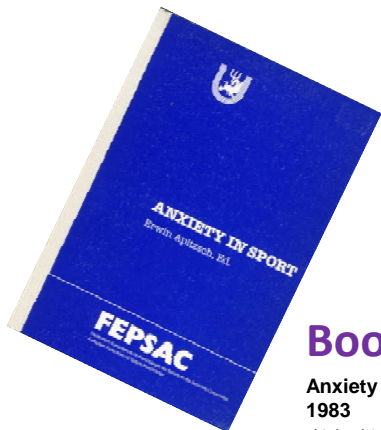


## Monographs and brochures

**Sport psychology in European Countries, edited by Paul Kunath in 1983**  
12 chapters reflected the development, the thematic focus and the structures in the following 11 Countries: GDF, Sweden, Bulgaria, USSR, FRG, Poland CSSR, Hungary, France, UK, Switzerland.

**Directory of European Sport Psychologists**  
Released in 1993, with 296 entries from 19 different countries.

**Monograph series**  
In 1999 the first monograph in the series was published on the topic of „Career transition in competitive sport“, edited by Paul Wylleman, David Lavallee and Dorothee Alfermann. 11 authors from 9 countries contributed to this comprehensive presentation on the conceptual description of the different transitions, the psychological interventions and the role of FEPSAC in career transition. Monograph #2, edited in 2003 by Erwin Apitzsch and Guido Schilling, covers the topic of „Sport psychology in Europe. FEPSAC – An organisational platform and scientific meeting point“ in 7 chapters, includes personal memories of the former FEPSAC presidents, the 7 position statements published so far and compiles all kind of information about the history of FEPSAC.

**European Perspectives on Exercise and Sport Psychology, edited by Stuart Biddle in 1995**

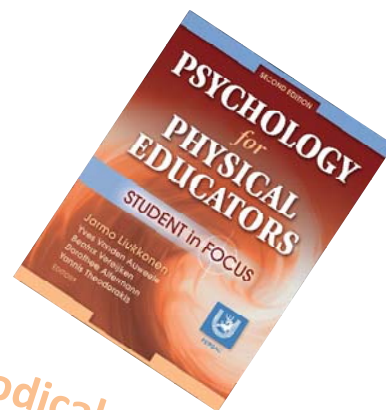
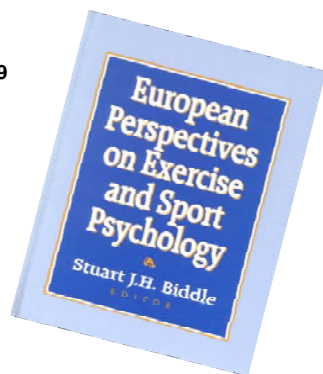
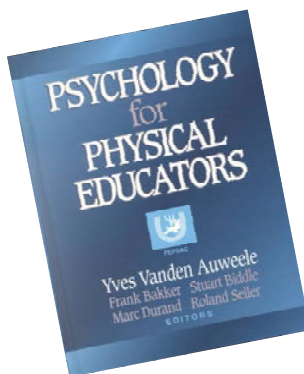
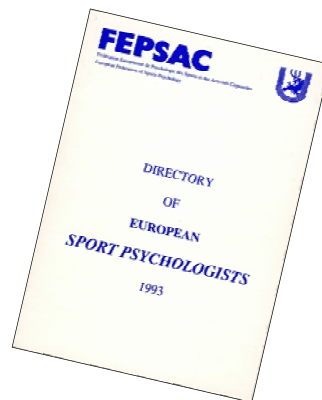
The 15 chapters compiled in this book give a broad overview of topics relevant in and typical for European sport psychology, encompassing 20 authors from 9 countries.

The book is structured in five sections, addressing the whole range of themes from the promotion of physical activity, exercise and health in physical education, psychological outcomes of P.E., the acquisition of motor skills and motor competences, social psychological aspects of physical education, and psychological strategies and concerns of the physical educator.

**Psychology for Physical Educators – Student in Focus (2<sup>nd</sup> edition), edited by Jarmo Liukkonen, Yves Vanden Auweele, Beatrix Vereijken, Dorothee Alfermann and Yannis Theodorakis in 2007**

The book is an adapted and revised second edition and includes four sections, aimed at giving students in physical education an updated view on psychological aspects of their field of study.



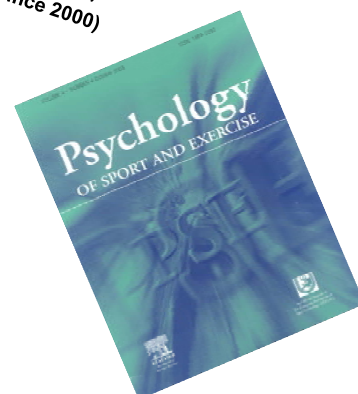

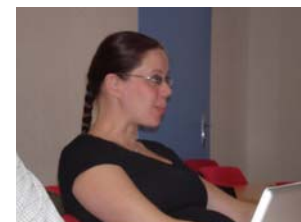
