## Lecturer (w,m,d)

The position will be a full-time (100%) Lecturer position, with a regular weekly working time of 39 hrs and 50 minutes.

The <u>Department of Performance Psychology</u> belongs to the active research groups in the field of sport psychology. The department and lab language is English. The department puts its several laboratories and technical support at disposal and offers the opportunity to further develop one's own scientific profile.

## **Tasks**

- German- and English-language teaching in the field of sport psychology, research methods and research design both in the Research Master Psychology in Sport and Exercise and in other Bachelor/Master programs
- Independent conception of lectures, seminars and tutorials
- Development of the main research focus on movement science, especially motor science; or neuroscience in the context of sport and exercise; or on research methods
- Publication of scientific papers in peer-reviewed journals
- Acquisition of research funding
- Development of a scientific cooperation network
- Supervision of theses (Bachelor and Master theses) as well as invigilating exams
- Participation in the administration of the Department of Performance Psychology

## Requiered are

- A completed academic university degree (Master degree) in psychology, sports psychology or sports science
- A completed PhD; or other scientific merits
  An elite sport performance, preferably international, may be recognized as an achievement in lieu of a doctorate.
- A strong interest in conducting scholarly work and research in the field of sport and performance psychology
- · Experience in obtaining external funding from national and/or international research agencies
- Experience with movement science methods, especially eye movement and movement analysis, or neuroscientific methods, e.g. EEG/TMS
- Experience with programming, e.g. Matlab, R
- Very good qualifications and experience in the area of university teaching and the supervision of Bachelor, Master, and eventually co-supervision of PhD theses
- Excellent written and spoken English
- Knowledge of German is an advantage, otherwise learning the German language will be a prerequisite
- Willingness to learn, strong initiative and a high degree of commitment
- Ability to work in a team, flexibility, resilience and willingness to help colleagues

- Experience in e-learning
